



Dear provider,

Hopefully by now you have heard the news reports regarding the potential for major flooding in the Kent, Auburn, Renton and surrounding areas. We hear at Child Care Resources want to help you be as prepared as possible to ensure the safety of you, and the children that you care for. As you prepare to minimize the impact on your homes and business, here is a list of things to help you prepare. While you may not be able to stop it from raining, you can take steps NOW to help minimize the impact. Below are simple steps to take to help be prepared. Phone numbers, resources and weblinks are provided on the second page. Questions to ask yourself:

### Things to do NOW!

- Is your emergency plan current?
  - Do you have current contact information (phone, cell, email) information for your families and staff?
  - Are your families aware of your plan? Do they know your plans?
  - Is your emergency kit fully stocked?
  - Do you have adequate supplies (food, water, etc.) in case you need to provide care and shelter for children for an extended period of time?
  
- Do you have adequate insurance to protect you and your business?
  
- Do you have a way to receive information should flooding occur and you lose power? Purchase an inexpensive AM radio or NOAA radio
  
- Do you have an adequate supply of first aid materials including medication for you staff and children should you need to provide care for an extended period of time?
  
- Are your important documents in a safe place? Do you have back-up copies? Have you backed up your computers important files onto a portable device (disk, jump/thumb drive, etc)?
  
- Are Hazardous chemicals stored safely, and out of floodwaters reach?
  
- Are your storm drains clear of leaves and other debris?
  
- Have you checked with your local city for resources and information? Some cities are providing training, sandbags (free or low cost), and other supports. Training can be a key step in minimizing the impact of the floods.
